Project hands on activity	College vet tech/pre-vet student talking about taking care of your cat/dog. Have a cat/dog to show how to care for pet. This would be divided into 2 or 4 groups.	1 1/2 hr.	Speaker, 1 or 2 cats, 1 or 2 dogs, grooming supplies (clippers, shampoo, scissors)
Recreation	Dog Obstacle course. Youth do the course.	20 min.	Tires, ramp, tunnel, other things used in a dog obstacle course.
Snack	Puppy Chow Kitty Litter Cake Beverage - Milk	10 min.	Puppy Chow Kitty Litter Cake Milk, Plates, Cups, Forks, Napkins
Optional business/decisions	Fundraising for your local animal shelter. Or donate time.	?
